





Flower - Chrysanthemum



November's birth flower is the

chrysanthemum.Commonly

called mums, the vibrant perennial

is a favorite of gardeners and

Birthstone - Yellow Topaz



Yellow topaz, known as "precious topaz," is November's birthstone. This stone was the symbol of Ra, the Egyptian sun god, because of its golden glow. Topaz was named

for the ancient island of Topasos, now known as St. John. A topaz is most commonly found in shades of yellow. However, it also comes in other colors, including blue, red, orange, green, and black. Pure topaz itself is a colorless stone. A gift of a yellow topaz symbolizes friendship and hospitality. Topaz is said to give the wearer strength and mental clarity.
